### Question 1: Operating Levy Increase

58.60% – Yes

41.40% – No

### Question 2: Capital Projects Levy

58.16% – Yes

41.84% – No

### Salem Hills Student’s Speech Spurs Fundraiser Success



Salem Hills Elementary School has partnered with H2O for Life since its inception 10 years ago to teach students about the global water crisis and engage them in service learning that helps those without access to clean water. This fall, H2O for Life asked Salem Hills 4th grader Courage O. to speak at the annual H2O for Life Water Ball, and he helped the organization hold its most successful event yet.

Courage told the audience about his first interaction with H2O for Life, seeing a video that explained the struggles that people in Africa face because they don’t have access to clean water.

“I was shocked by what I was seeing,” he said. “I thought everyone had what they needed.”

The video spurred him to action. He wanted to help not only because he saw people in need, but also because his parents were born in Africa.

“Those people in the video are my people,” he said. “That’s my family tree.”

He talked about how H2O for Life believed in him to make a difference, despite his young age. Throughout his speech, audience members were seen wiping away tears. Courage’s testimonial helped H2O for Life raise more than \$180,000. The funds will support service learning projects across the U.S. that help battle the global water crisis while giving students an innovative role in real-world problem-solving.

### Incumbents, Lounsberry Selected for School Board Terms Starting January 2018



On November 7, voters selected Cindy Nordstrom, Lynette Stensgard, and Carrie Lounsberry for the ISD 199 School Board beginning January 2018. Inver Grove Heights Schools is honored to be selected as the winner in the “Best Use of Taxpayer Money” category. In 2013, our community helped us construct and update facilities at Salem Hills Elementary School and Simley High School after a year-long facility study. The media center added at Salem Hills and the theatre, Spartan Center meeting room, student center, and track and field added at Simley have maximized educational programs and services for our students as well as our community members.

Since all of the projects were completed during the 2016-2017 school year, hundreds of informational and extracurricular events have been held at the new facilities. Community members and organizations have held gatherings in the Spartan Center and Student Center, enjoyed numerous performances by elementary and secondary students in the new Simley Performing Arts Center, and cheered on their favorite Spartans as they competed on the new track and turf field. The new construction also put updated security measures in place to reduce any potential risks to student safety.

This is the fourth year in a row that Simley High School has been chosen as the Readers’ Choice “Best School.” Simley was chosen out of a pool of more than 60 eligible schools. Simley High School strives for whole-student development, helping students gain the skills they need for graduation and beyond. The school emphasizes earning college credit or certification while in high school to give students opportunities upon graduation. While the school promotes high academic standards, staff work to create a supportive environment where all students can thrive.

“Along with offering relevant and rigorous curriculum so students see the value of lessons, we have an excellent staff that focuses on developing relationships with the kids,” Simley Principal Jerry Sakala said. “They let students know they care, and that is an important factor in motivating students to graduate, especially those who are at-risk.”

MSBA programs and trainings help board members better serve their districts and communities by providing information about school finance, education legislation, and more topics unique to school districts. Director Schaefer, who was inducted as a board member in 2016, earned the recognition in less than two years.

**Elementary Teachers Earn TIES Exceptional Teacher Award**



Exceptional Teacher Awards recognize teachers who go above and beyond to engage students. This year, local education group TIES awarded Hilltop Elementary School 5th grade teacher Jessica Goodwin and Salem Hills Elementary School 1st grade teacher Kevin Warner.

Mr. Warner was recognized for his skills in building relationships and introducing his young students to technology. Ms. Goodwin was recognized for putting ideas into action, teaching her students coding and blogging through hands-on lessons.

PBIS coaches from schools across the metro visited to learn about more ideas for implementing PBIS and helping students grow in and out of the classroom.

**Salem Hills Holds STEAM Night to Explore Skills with Family**

Salem Hills Elementary School and its Atheneum Gifted Magnet Program hosted a STEAM Night for families. Numerous STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art, and Math) activities challenged students and their families to work together and use their creativity to problem-solve. Families learned about and explored new technologies, such as 3D printers and a Sphero, which is a ball that students can control by coding instructions on an iPad.

The Simley High School Robotics Team also visited the event to show students the team robot. Simley students built the robot last year, advancing to the worldwide FIRST Robotics Playoffs. Elementary students learned about the team and their options for the future. Families also enjoyed a light dinner and a Mariachi band. Friends of the Inver Glen Library sent each student home with an age-appropriate book so families can continue learning together.

The passage of the two referendum questions is **not included** in the Proposed Taxes for 2018 due to county mailing timelines. The school district portion of taxes was scheduled to go down 1.3% this year due to the district's refunding efforts. While school district property taxes may increase for 2018, the three cumulative refunding efforts will help lessen the burden. Refunding has already amounted to more than \$5 million in savings for taxpayers since 2010.

### Simley Wrestler Wins Gold in World Championship



In the spring, Simley High School junior and two-time 2A wrestling state champion, Greg Kerkvliet, traveled to Ohio to try out for the United World Wrestling (UWW) Cadet Nationals. This summer, he returned from the 2017 Cadet World Championship with a gold medal.

Greg has been wrestling since he was in kindergarten. He said his goal has always been competing in world championships, so when he had the chance to try out for the UWW Cadet Nationals, he took it. Despite having had knee surgery only two weeks before trials, Greg earned a spot in Nationals. He trained with the top wrestlers and coaches, learning what he could from them, and won all of his matches to qualify for the World Championship in Athens, Greece.

At the World Championship in September, Greg wrestled the best athletes in the world while unable to straighten his arm due to an elbow injury. Still, he won all four matches by 10 points or more. He won his final match against Russia’s Ismail-Bek Nirov 2-1, earning the 100kg gold medal. Greg’s win also helped America earn four golds in the Men’s Freestyle World Championship, something that has not happened in nearly 25 years, and place second as a team.

Greg hopes to compete in more state, national, and world championships in the future and maybe even the Olympics. After the Cadet level, which consists of competitors ages 15-17, Greg will be able to compete in Junior-, University-, and Senior-level championships.

### Student Advisory Council Meets for 2017-2018 School Year



Each year, Inver Grove Heights Schools Superintendent Dave Bernhardson gathers 4th, 7th, and 11th graders from every school to participate in Student Advisory Council. Students learn about what is happening at a districtwide level and provide a student perspective to help administrators and board members make decisions that affect students. The Council met for the first time this year on October 11 to discuss their responsibilities and take a tour of the ISD 199 District Office, learning what each department does and how they work together to help the district function.

### Simley Theatre Takes on Shakespeare

Simley Theatre performed “A Midsummer Night’s Dream” this November. The Simley High School and Inver Grove Heights Middle School cast and crew created a funny and well-crafted production to tell William Shakespeare’s story of lovers, aspiring actors, and magical fairies.

The Simley High School Marching Band had a busy and successful start to the school year, participating in five parades by November. Students marched at the Inver Grove Heights Days, Osseo Lions Roar, and Defeat of Jesse James Day parades and competed against area high schools in the Minnesota State Fair Parade and Anoka Halloween Parade.

The band competed in the Minnesota State Fair Marching Band Competition alongside four other area bands. While Simley’s band earned high scores in the competition, they also earned high praise from spectators who had come from across the state and beyond.

Simley’s marching band was the only group to wear uniforms. One parent heard people cheering, “Way to go Simley! You look great!” and “Yes! Uniforms! You know how to do it right.” People also approached band members, who were wearing their Simley band shirts after the competition, to tell them what a great job they did.

Simley placed second out of the day’s four competing bands, earning 72.3 points. Out of the total nine days of competitions, Simley placed 10th out of 28 competing high school marching bands.

Though marching band members opted for costumes instead of their band uniforms for the Anoka Halloween Parade competition, they earned multiple awards for their performance. The band placed 1st in the Class A Marching Band Competition, and they earned recognition for Best Percussion and Best Color Guard. Congratulations to all of the students!

### Link and WEB Leaders Welcome Incoming Students



The first day of school can be exciting, but it can also be intimidating, especially when students start at a new school. This year, Simley High School and Inver Grove Heights Middle School started school for 6th and 9th graders one day early to help them ease into their transition. Extracurricular groups of upperclassmen, Simley Link Leaders and IGHMS WEB (Where Everyone Belongs) Leaders, also attended the 6th- and 9th-grade only days to help familiarize their younger peers with the new schools and connect with them to make their transition easier.

Simley formed Link Crew last year to help incoming freshmen transition smoothly into their new school. Each Link Leader was given a group of new students to connect with at 9th Grade Orientation before the first day of school, and they were there for the 9th graders on the first day of school to help them again. Throughout the rest of the year, Link Leaders will also act as resources for their 9th grade groups.

“Freshmen are welcomed to our school by older students who have discovered what it takes to be successful in high school,” Simley English teacher and Link Crew co-organizer Bobby Mandell said. “It’s like having an older sibling who can teach you all of the unwritten rules so you don’t have to make mistakes just to learn them.”

IGHMS implemented a similar change for incoming 6th graders this year. WEB Leaders applauded students as they arrived, made them feel welcome, and helped them navigate their new environment throughout their first day in middle school. WEB leaders will also continue to act as resources for the 6th graders throughout the school year.



### SIMLEY HALL OF FAME

On September 15, two Simley High School alumnae were inducted into the school’s Hall of Fame. Kelly Gillet and Tanya “Nord” Iverson earned a place in the Hall of Fame for their continuously outstanding accomplishments in high school, college, and professional activities and athletics. The women participated in an induction ceremony and were recognized at half-time during the night’s Spartan football game.

Kelly Gillet, Simley Class of 2012, was honored for her extensive accomplishments in dance. Ms. Gillet was a Minnesota Timberwolves dance team member during the 2016-2017 season and earned the Minnesota Timberwolves “Calm Before the Storm Athlete” recognition for her ability to keep calm and work through stressful situations. Ms. Gillet visits the high school often to help the Simley Dance Team.

Tanya “Nord” Iverson, Simley Class of 1988, was honored for her accomplishments in swimming, synchronized swimming, cross-country skiing, band, and dance. Ms. Iverson set a Simley record in the 400 Freestyle Relay in 1985 and was inducted into the University of Wisconsin-Eau Claire Athletic Hall of Fame in 2016. She has also worked as a high school and YMCA swimming coach as well as a swimming and diving official for the Minnesota and Wisconsin high school sports associations. Currently, she coaches the Simley Girls Swimming and Diving Team.



**Nearly 90 Simley Students Earn Recognition as AP Scholars**

Advanced Placement (AP) classes challenge students with college-level coursework and provide an opportunity to earn college credit while they are still enrolled in high school. Students earn college credit depending on their AP exam score at the end of the year, which can range from 0-5 points. In addition to college credit, students can also earn recognition as an AP Scholar with high AP exam scores. This year, 89 Simley High School students earned AP Scholar Awards in four categories.
