COLLEGE EXPLORATION OPPORTUNITIES EXPLORE COLLEGES VIRTUALLY & IN PERSON THIS SPRING!

During the spring months, the majority of colleges and universities hold special sessions and events to get prospective students on campus and for families to learn about their programs and what they have to offer. While most colleges have had to cancel or minimize these large-scale events, many schools are starting to open up for in-person tours. *Spots are typically limited and require a reservation but if you are able to get on campus, do it!* It is one of the very best ways to really understand what you are looking for in a school and if a particular campus will (or won't) be a good fit for you!

Still other schools have shifted these opportunities to be virtual. They are still very worth checking out! These sessions and special events are typically aimed at juniors but all are welcome to attend and learn more about different colleges. Below are a few upcoming, local opportunities to take advantage of!

ASVAB TO BE OFFERED AT SIMLEY ASVAB CAREER EXPLORATION PROGRAM

While the ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Test) is a requirement for those planning on joining any branch of the military, the exam and specifically the career exploration program isn't just for students interested in the military. The ASVAB Career Exploration Program helps students to discover their strengths and interests then map out post-secondary plans with comprehensive information for over 1,000 occupations.

The ASVAB Career Exploration Program is open to any Simley Student in grade 10-12 who want to learn more about their career options or for those that are interested in joining the military. There are 2 parts to the ASVAB Career Exploration Program.

Part 1: Aptitude Test on Wednesday, April 21, 2021 at 8:30 AM

Part 2: Score interpretation, interest self-assessment, and career exploration tools (May- date/time TBD).

SCHOLARSHIP TIPS AND STRATEGIES

- Create a separate email address specifically for scholarships so that your primary email isn't flooded.
- Read the directions. Follow the directions.
- It's a numbers game- be strategic with where you are spending your time. Apply more to win more.
- You CANNOT win if you don't apply.
- It gets easier after the first 6 applications.
- Be open, honest, and yourself! Make it personal.
- Don't throw out small scholarships- they add up!
- Tailor your application to meet the sponsor's goals

- Create a resume/activity list so that you don't have to recreate it each time.
- Reuse your essays! If it is the same topic or similar question, be efficient and reuse essays.
- Be diligent and set aside time to specifically work on scholarships.
- The more local you can stay, the better.
- If a scholarship looks like a lot of work, consider applying, as typically these have less competition.
- NEVER pay to be considered for a scholarship.
