FINANCIAL AID EVENTS ARE AVAILABLE TO MN STUDENTS AND FAMILIES

FREE TRIP TO WASHINGTON D.C. ON YOUTH TOUR

DAKOTA ELECTRIC ASSOCIATION/RURAL ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE

Dakota Electric Association will provide five high school sophomores, juniors and seniors the opportunity to travel to Washington, D.C. as part of the National Rural Electric Cooperative Association's (NRECA) Youth Tour, **June 14-19, 2022.**



Each June, more than 1,500 students from across the country travel to Washington, D.C. for the NRECA Youth Tour. During the trip, they learn about electric cooperatives and government, meet elected officials and tour national monuments and sites, including the Smithsonian, the FBI building and more.

ACT OFFERED FREE TO ALL JUNIORS

TEST WILL TAKE PLACE ON MARCH 8, 2021

We are administering the ACT Plus Writing, free of charge, to all juniors on **Tuesday, March 8, 2022** starting at 8:30 a.m. All 11th grade students will be excused from their classes on Tuesday, March 8th so that they may test if they choose. 11th grade students who take the ACT Plus Writing will be excused from school after the conclusion of the test. *Families of junior students will receive a letter in the mail soon with more detailed information.*

9th, 10th, and 12th grade students will have an at-home alternative learning day on March 8, 2022, which means they will <u>not</u> be in attendance at Simley High School on that day. Rather, students will work at home (self–paced) on class assignments in Schoology. Teachers will be available for virtual support during their regular class hours. A letter with more in-depth information and next steps will be going out to families of juniors soon.

As an alternative to the ACT, we will also be offering the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) Career Exploration Program (CEP) to 11th and 12th graders at the same time as the ACT. This is an excellent alternative to the ACT for students who are interested in the military pathway or for those who are not considering a 4-year college but still want to explore their future options. Please note that ASVAB scores are not released to the military but there is an opt-in release form for any student who wishes to send their scores to the military.
