In conjunction with MN free application week, we held an "Application Completion Day" late in the month. This event was an awesome success in getting seniors to ask questions, plan, and make progress on their applications. AP TEST REGISTRATION

AP registration is open! Students should have "joined" their course on https://myap.collegeboard.org/login using a join code provided their teacher. Once that is complete, students need to pay for their exam. This year, registration will take place on **Smart School K-12** (on the parent portal). Cost is \$56/exam or \$5/exam if you qualify for educational benefits. **Registration is due on November 5th**. After this date, ordering an exam will include an additional \$40 fee from the College Board. Additional information can be found at: https://bit.ly/APregistration21.

WHAT SHOULD SENIORS BE DOING?

In general, seniors should have the following completed or be working toward completion this month:

Finalize post-secondary path/plan. (2-year technical or community college, 4-year college, apprenticeship, work, military) Within that path/plan, **narrow down and finalize** the list of schools they plan to apply to, branch they want to enlist in, trade they want to pursue, etc. Seniors applying to college should have a safety, match, and reach school on their list.

• **Not sure how?** Work on researching different types of schools, branches of military, talk with reps, attend college and job fairs, etc. (This newsletter includes a ton of exploration opportunities to take advantage of!)

Apply! If college is in the plans, now is the time to complete applications. Don't forget to send your transcripts (https://bit.ly/simleytranscript), pay the application fee, and submit any additional required materials. Your application will not be reviewed until all required pieces are submitted. If you qualify for education benefits see your counselor for a fee waiver. **Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid** (FAFSA) pursuing any kind of higher education. (www.fafsa.gov) Start or continue applying for **scholarships**. Check out https://bit.ly/collegeFA101 for more financial aid info and resources.


